Paper title: Generational and Territorial Cleavage – Effects on the Party System

Abstract: The emerging of new type cleavages – the generational and the Center – Periphery cleavage can be observed in some states in Central and East Europe. On the basis of case study I am going to review the reasons for the appearance of such cleavage potential in Bulgaria and its effects on the political systems in the state. It is interesting that the Center – Periphery cleavage is different than the traditional understanding of such based on the Lipset and Rokkan work, which is territorial and connected with the local communities' desire for more autonomy from the central government. However, in Bulgaria's case this cleavage should be understood as the big difference between the capital city and the individual provincial areas which have been dwindled and marginalized after the end of the communist rule. It is also interesting to follow whether there have been changes in the Generational cleavage. During the first party system in Bulgaria (1990–2001) there is a trend, in which the younger voters give their vote for the right-wing parties, and the elder – for the left-wing. After 2001, a new type of party system is established, where the traditional cleavages are not of such big importance. That is why it is interesting to follow the cleavage potential of the generational differences and the variation of the Center – Periphery Cleavage (of those two cross-cutting cleavages). The existing of such will be proven by the implementation of quantitative and regression analysis.
